Cultivating human resources

Our graduate school offers this doctoral program with the aim of cultivating highly creative researchers who can amalgamate knowledge and culture through a cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary lens to create new insights and value. The program integrates the humanities with the social and natural sciences to cultivate advanced research skills that will allow students to independently conduct original research toward solving the increasingly complex and diverse challenges of modern society. Students will simultaneously acquire abundant knowledge to support such endeavors.

Admission policy

To cultivate highly creative researchers who can contribute new insights and value by integrating diverse knowledge and culture from cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary perspectives, the doctoral program at our graduate school admits students in accordance with the following policies, with consideration to the curriculum, based on the diploma and curriculum policies.

- Knowledge and Skills (AP1)

The doctoral program targets students who have, upon completion of their master's degree, acquired a solid foundation of interdisciplinary knowledge that integrates the humanities with the social and natural sciences. The desired student should possess a wealth of academic knowledge in their specialized field(s), which will enable them to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to engage in advanced research activities in the doctoral program. We value individuals who have a strong grasp of the English language because this will facilitate their participation in international research exchanges and presentations.

- Ability to think, judge, express, etc. (AP2)

The program is intended for students who demonstrate a global perspective, the ability to think outside the box, and the capacity to engage in creative thinking and apply logical and flexible judgment in response to complex and diverse issues. The program seeks individuals who can express themselves palatably and comprehensibly to both expert and non-expert audiences.

- Proactive attitude (AP3)

This program is intended for individuals who will take the initiative to address global problems such as poverty, conflict, infectious diseases, and environmental destruction, as well as the other diverse challenges of modern society. This program particularly welcomes students who can accurately grasp and analyze the current situation, choose their own research topics, and adopt a unique approach toward finding a solution.

Admission screening

Admission is limited to three (3) students selected from among candidates for a general entrance examination that is open to the public. The examination is open to a wide range of applicants including current students of the University, students from other universities, and working adults who have the qualifications required for admission to the doctoral program. Working adults eligible to take the entrance examination do not receive special consideration; however, we maintain an environment and a system that facilitates learning for employed adults. For example, we recognize credits acquired before entering the Graduate School (including credits acquired as a non-degree student at a graduate school), we provide an extended enrollment period, and we operate flexible class hours per the Special Exception to Article 14 of the Standards for the Establishment of Graduate Schools.

5. Qualifications required to apply

Applicants must meet or expect to meet any of the following criteria by March 31, 2026:

- (1) Have a master's or professional degree
- (2) Have been conferred a degree equivalent to a master's or professional degree in a foreign country (***1 Prior confirmation of eligibility is required**)
- (3) Have completed a program via correspondence courses in Japan that were offered by a school in a foreign country and have received a degree equivalent to a master's or professional degree (***1 Prior confirmation of eligibility is required**)
- (4) Have completed a course designated by the minister of education, culture, sports, science and technology ([the Japan campus of a foreign university designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology](#)) and been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's or professional degree by an educational institution in Japan that was established in accordance with the educational system of a foreign country and is designated as the above (***1 Prior confirmation of eligibility is required**)
- (5) Have completed a course at the United Nations University and received a degree equivalent to a master's degree (***1 Prior confirmation of eligibility is required**)
- (6) Have completed a curriculum at a foreign school, an educational institution designated per (4), or the United Nations University; passed examinations and screenings equivalent to those stipulated in Article 16-2 of the Standards for Establishment of the Graduate School; and are recognized as having academic abilities equivalent to or exceeding that of a master's degree holder (***1 Prior confirmation of eligibility is required**)
- (7) Have graduated from a university, etc., have engaged in research at a university or research institute for 2 years or more, and have been recognized by the Graduate School as possessing academic abilities equivalent to or exceeding that of a master's degree holder (***2 Individual eligibility screening is required for admission**)
- (8) Have been recognized by the Graduate School as having academic abilities equivalent to or exceeding that of a master's or professional degree holder based on an individual entrance examination and have reached the age of 24 years by the time of enrollment (***2 Individual eligibility screening is required for admission**)

***1 Eligibility confirmation prior to application**

Prospective applicants who qualify under (2)–(6) must request confirmation of eligibility from the Admissions Office of the Graduate School of International Liberal Arts, Juntendo University, before applying.

The examination will be conducted online. Examinees are not required to come to Japan to do the entrance examination.

- ① An internet connection test will be conducted before the examination date.
- ② On the day of the examination, please access the examination website, which will be designated in advance, using the method instructed. Please be punctual.
- ③ The examination must be taken in a private room. No third party is allowed to be present during the examination.
- ④ Recording video or audio and taking photos of the examination are prohibited. Examinees must also refrain from conveying the content of the examination to third parties. If an examinee is found to have engaged in any of the prohibited activities, they will be regarded as having cheated and the entire examination will be invalidated.

Internet environment

Examinees must have internet access to complete the online oral examination. Please ensure an internet speed of 10 Mbps or higher in the environment where the exam will be taken.

- ① To determine internet speed, enter “internet speed test” in a search engine and run a test to measure the speed.

※In accordance with the Juntendo University Graduate School admission scholarship regulations, admitted students who are Juntendo University graduates and employees (working full time at the time of admission) are eligible to apply for a scholarship worth half of the admission fee after admission. Scholarship awardees will be selected by the University.

※Privately financed international students may receive a tuition reduction in accordance with the Juntendo University regulations on scholarships for international students.

※In principle, payments will not be returned. However, those who have notified the University by noon on Monday, March 21, 2025, of their intention to withdraw and have submitted the withdrawal form and the refund request form specified by the University will receive a refund excluding the entrance fee.

15. Other

Long-term enrollment system

The long-term enrollment system allows students who are working, giving birth, raising a child, or providing nursing care to establish a plan to complete a master's degree program over a maximum of 3 years. 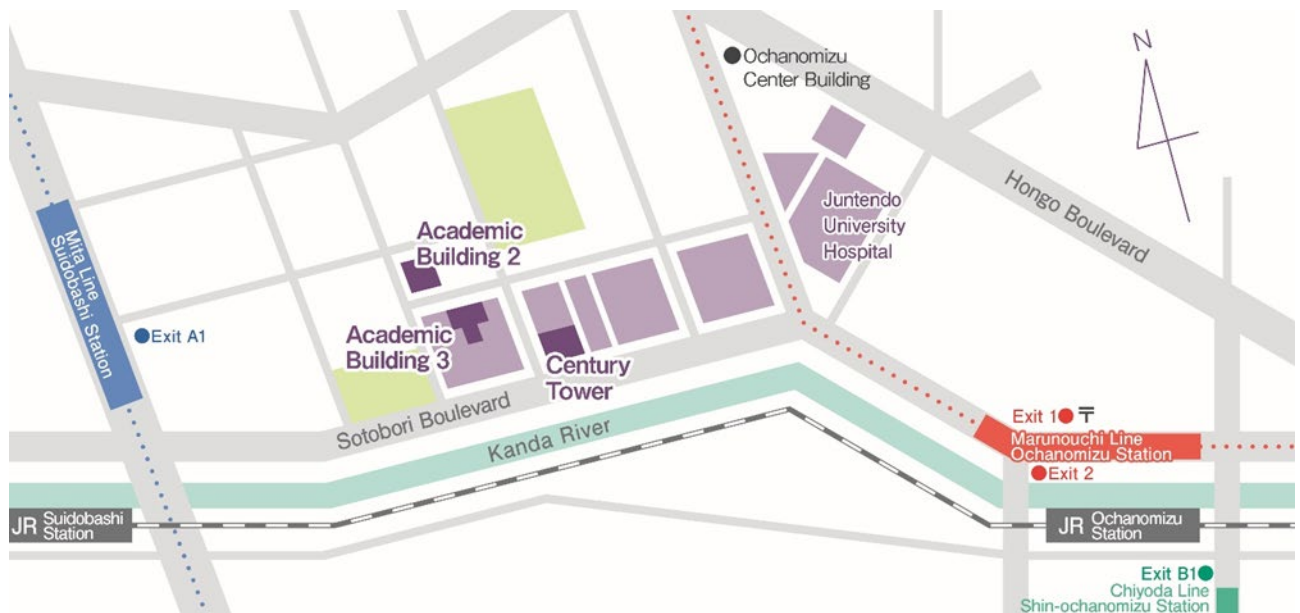
Research assistants
